- 6. Aggregated Diploma results are a weighted average of percent meeting standards (Acceptable, Excellence) on Diploma Examinations. The weights are the number of students writing the Diploma Examination for each course. Courses included: English Language Arts 30-1, English Language Arts 30-2, French Language Arts 30-1, Français 30-1, Mathematics 30-1, Mathematics 30-2, Chemistry 30, Physics 30, Biology 30, Science 30, Social Studies 30-1, Social Studies 30-2.

Commentary and Analysis:

This summary chart suggests the DRWLC Citizenship measure is slightly below the province's Current Result and has decreased from the previous school year. The Achievement measure remains Very High; however, it is an area that should be given strong consideration in the school planning process. Wilson Wellness team is engaged in the Comprehensive School Health Model to promote student engagement and citizenship. Education Quality remains Very High and is above both the province's Current Result and Pervious 3 Year Average. The results in this area are considered a strength. Parent Involvement increased from 69.1 to 77.0 and is slightly below the provincial average of 79.1. The school administration and staff will seek new partnerships with the school advisory council and increase communication of the learning process with families. The school will continue to engage parents with the Edsby platform to complement existing forms of communication.

In future school communications with families, both at the classroom and school level, continued emphasis will be placed on sharing and highlighting the ways students take on responsibility and be active citizens in their school and the broader community. The creation of a Student Willson Wellness team to support our students will create opportunities for students to demonstrate active citizenship. Collecting feedback at School Advisory Council meetings can support work in this area. Continued sharing on social media (Facebook & Instagram) to share with the community at large, student citizenship at Dr. Roy Wilson Learning Centre.

Commentary and Analysis:

This summary chart indicates the importance of creating learning opportunities that engage students. Work in this area for the 2023-24 school year continues through engaging in the Teacher Clarity process. This can be achieved through ongoing check-ins and increased student involvement in discussing learning intentions and the development of success criteria. Teacher collaborative time has been embedded within the timetable to allow teachers to meet to plan engaging units of study. Teachers will collaborate and support each other to increase their students' understanding of what they are learning and their involvement in the learning process.

Commentary and Analysis:

Student results decreased slightly from 2022 to 2023, however teacher and parent results increased slightly. We continue to put emphasis and attention on Mental Health support in schools. The Family School Liaison Worker and Success Coach serve an important role. Various district Mental Health supports have been implemented (Our Collective Journey, Social Emotional Curriculum, Robb Nash Curriculum). Classroom Support Teachers (CSTs) and Optimal Learning Coaches (OLCs) were available and ready to support teachers and schools at each stage of the Continuum of Supports. Continued benefits of literacy and numeracy intervention support are evident in classrooms.

Commentary and Analysis:

The School Parent Advisory Council at Dr. Roy Wilson Learning Centre continues to find ways to work with the school staff and administrators to involve parents with school events and fundraising opportunities. In the latter part of 2022-23 school year, we saw an increase in parent volunteers within our building as well as an increase in parents accessing EDSBY. Continued commitment by teachers in the utilization of Edsby Gradebook, Learning Story and River of News to share feedback with families about their child's learning before the formal report card dates. The school welcomes parent input and reviews their comments and feedback collected through the OurSchool Survey and the Alberta Education Assurance Survey. These strategies are intended to promote increased parental involvement in their children's education.
